- Theme: How to enter the kingdom of heaven. Mt. 5.20; 7.13; 21
- Immediate literary setting: "You have heard that it was said..." Mt. 5.21ff

KEEPING OUR COMMITMENTS

- "...you shall not swear falsely but shall perform..."
 - The expectation was that you keep your vows. Lev. 19.12, Num. 30.12; Deut. 23.21-24
 - -Oaths were meant to give assurance. cf. Heb. 6.12
- "but I say to you do not take an oath at all either by..."
 - The Jews turned oaths into vehicles for dishonesty. Matt. 23.16-22
- "Let what you say be simple yes or no..."
 - The righteousness of the kingdom demands integrity.

- Make time.
